The GEB is a four-day educational/leadership session designed for the youth with

Magic Razik (real name "Rashik Mohtasin") is a magician and mentalist.

Razik completed his A' Levels from Sunshine Grammar School where he had performed his trick and illusions during Annual Cultural Shows and also for various charity events organized by the School. After graduation from Sunshine, Razik got admitted into Queen Mary, University of London. The support from the school not only helped Razik in his higher education but helped him hone this skill when performing magic on stage. After completing undergrads degree, he ventured to Australia where he completed his Masters Degree in Information Technology at Charles Sturt University, with Distinctions and the Honour of being valedictorian of his batch. Not only does he perform roving magic, he has also been hired for repeat appearances to kick off sales pitches for multi-million dollar deals. His unique magic performances have graced the stages of global conferences & events for these companies, most often as the headline attraction of the event.

TAMIM IQBAL KHAN

Sunshine is proud of Tamim Iqbal Khan, an alumnus who has proven himself as one of the world's best cricketers. Tamim joined Sunshine when he was a toddler and completed his O' Levels under Edexcel in 2004. He is currently the highest run scorer for Bangladesh in international cricket across all formats with runs of 6892, 4327 & 1613 in One-Day Internationals, Tests and International T20s respectively. Tamim is the first Bangladeshi cricketer to score over 10,000 international runs and is the only Bangladeshi cricketer to score a century across all the three formats of the game. Furthermore, he holds the distinction of scoring the highest number of centuries, in total twenty-one, for the Bangladeshi cricket team. An extraordinary batting display in the T20 World Cup 2016 in India, saw him emerge as the high scorer of that global event.





Sunshine celebrates World Environment Day






Kindergarten Story Telling Sessions

Madam also made me host a program that was aired on BTV Hoday, when I get through and own up many complex situations, I realise how I owe a big part of my grooming to my Sunshine, Ms. Safia Ghazi Rahman besides my parents.

At the age of 5, I was asked what I wanted to become when I grow up; to Suralya teacher's and madam's surprise my answer was "A Barrister" as that's the only thing I heard at home ever since I can recall, it was my father's manifestation of his dream which he dreamt even before we were born, to get us (sisters) qualified as Barristers. We are three sisters and a brother. My younger sisters, who are now my fellow colleagues, Barrister Fatilmah Waanithah Ahsan and Barrister Priya Ahsan are also Sunshiners for they did their elementary schooling in Sunshine Grammar School

We grew up in a very different household where there was never any discrimination, in fact, I never had the idea of gender inequality for a very long time as I saw women around me doing very well. Madam was one of the mentors whom I always remember with high regards. She was a human being who was doing very well, and I never think of her as a woman, she is a successful human being. She indeed has been very powerful, and she thrives to do better every day. She set her benchmark so high that none of her successors (where I humbly include myself too) could reach yet. She's my numero uno when it comes to education. In absence of easy internet or social media, she was a visionary of her times to have dreamt of an educated and a civil society in a country like Bangladesh, in a city like Chittagong. It all looks very easy from the surface, but I am sure she has fought

enough and still fighting to provide the best for her children (the children of the world). She's undoubtedly a survivor. I have seen her reaching out to concerned people to solve every problem. She takes things as a challenge and makes sure she comes out a winner. She has not only beaten cancer but has beaten the societal taboos. She taught us to be charitable and to be beside the less fortunate. Within school campus we had classes going on for the less privileged.

I want to mention an interesting story from my senior. school. Madam often visited the UK for work commitments. Like other schools, we didn't have a vice principal as such. Ms. Safia Rahman was a one woman show. Madam called me to her room during break and asked me #1 wanted to be Safia Rahman for 10 days. To my utter astonishment. I was jumping inside to be able to replicate her role in her absence. As a 14 year old, it was one of those dream come true moments. My job was to supervise all classes, collect finished English homework and keep it safely in her room, I was given the responsibility of conducting English Classes of Class VI VII VIII in her absence, which she very clearly planned and programmed. I now feel, by giving me responsibilities heavier than my shoulders could bear, Madam prepared me for the real world. She boosted my confidence by leaps and helped me think independently. Upon her return, she handed me a bar of chocolate and thanked me humbly for doing the job right. I looked at her and said, "Madam, you haven't seen the work yet and handed me the chocolate of appreciation early." In response, she said, "It doesn't matter how well you did your job, the very effort that you put at this age without fear in itself is praiseworthy." AND that is what makes Madam the most encouraging woman and the wind beneath our wings.

Often times I feel madam was biased towards me, I wasn't all that great to be in her shadow all the time. I still do not know what kept us so close to each other. Many of my classmates would call me her pet when I denied without fail to go against any of her decisions. It was not because I was a blind follower, it was because what she understood in a heartbeat was lightlyears away from others undestanding. The facilities that we had in school during our times were world class and Madam was very particular about maintaining a one to one relationship with every student.

In a nutshell, I can put my hand on my heart and say what I am today and what I will ever be. Sunshine will forever be in me. Madam has done her bit for Sunshine and I am sure every now and then, she gets to see the fruit of that investment in real time. Let there be grace, love, discipline, faith, light, hope, joy and lots of Sunshine.




